In the town of Big Stone Gap, Virginia, not much happens. The highlight of 35-year-old Ave Maria Mulligan's week comes on Friday, with the arrival of the Bookmobile, the sight of which sends her into raptures. Her favorite book concerns the ancient Chinese art of reading faces. Through her face-readings, we come to understand the hostilities simmering within her family: her father whose small eyes are the clear "sign of a deceptive nature." Her aunt who "has a small head and thin lips. (That's a terrible combination.)" Adriana Trigiani's first novel concerns the family scandals that befall Ave Maria in this seemingly uneventful town. Greed, lust, envy--all the ancient emotional elements--manifest themselves even in this hamlet of "ordinary folk." Fans of Fannie Flagg or Rebecca Wells will enjoy this down-home tale, full of small, everyday details and colloquial revelations. The writing is often awkward, but so too are the characters who inhabit this place: the Bookmobile lady who thinks of herself as the sexiest woman alive; the amateur actors in the local Outdoor Drama who bristle with ambition when they hear that Elizabeth Taylor is coming to visit. Debra Anne: This feel-good story is set in the Virginia hills, with a charming cast of small-town personalities that revolve around the narrator, one Ave Maria whose Italian mother had her out of wedlock and brought her up in bluegrass country. So why didn't I give it a higher rating?

Despite the exuberance of the narrator, this is still basically a book with a plotline I hate -- Whiney bitch out to find herself. Typical of these plotlines, Ave Maria, has at least one person madly in love with her -- to the point that the poor fellow sells his spanking new pickup truck in order to buy her an expensive surprise. As usual, I have trouble relating to the problems that push these personalities to the brink. Okay, her beloved mother has recently died, and she has discovered that her stepfather isn't her real dad, and she has a wicked step aunt lurking at the edges of the narrative trying to take her step-inheritance away from her. But honestly, is this enough to make someone collapse into a seven-day sleep? Not in my universe.

In fairness, I will say that Ave Maria's narrative voice is too exuberant to qualify as pure whiny bitch, and she manages to give a lot to the community and people around her despite her preoccupation with herself and her apparent frailty when it comes to dealing with life. Maybe it's because up until her mother's illness, she hasn't had any real blows except for a gnawing suspicion that the man she thought was her father didn't love her. The father issue, by the way, seems to be the underpinning of the whole narrative -- because she didn't feel "protected" by a father figure, she cannot commit to love.

I think that is the other problem I have with this cheerful, easy-reading book. Everyone in it is too darn nice, and they all watch over Ave Maria, waiting for her to come to her senses -- not just one village of Ave Maria admirers, but two, one in Italy and one in Big Stone Gap. Ave Maria is the center of everyone's universe as well as her own, and I found that plain irritating not to mention downright unreal.

Mary Ronan Drew: When I was in college I drove to school every day in my 1955 Buick Dynaflo. These trips were almost entirely uneventful. But one morning when it had snowed heavily overnight I slid into a snowbank on Main Street in front of the Braleys' house. Arthur came out and helped shovel me out and I was on my way. No big deal. But when I got home that evening, my mother was waiting at the door to see if I'd been hurt or if there had been any damage to the car. How did she know it had happened? Six or eight people had phoned her that day to ask about it. That's how it is in a small town. Everybody knows your news before you do.

Big Stone Gap, a real place in the Blue Ridge Mountains of far southwestern Virginia is a town like that, or it was in 1978 when Adriana Trigiani's novel takes place. Ave Maria Mulligan is the town pharmacist like her father before her and at 35, she is considered the town spinster. She has a reasonably full life, directing the town's summer drama production (named for *The Trail of the Linesome Pine*, the 1908 book by John Fox), delivering prescriptions to shut-ins, reading books from the book mobile, chatting with her friend Iva Lou, and hanging out with her best friend, Theodore Tipton, band director at the high school. . . .

Sarah: This is the book that started my mom's & my love for Adriana Trigiani. I decided to reread the whole Big Stone Gap series in anticipation of the new installment, *Home to Big Stone Gap*. Rereading a book I got ten years ago was really fun. Generally I don't reread books because there are too many new books out there for me to read, but maybe I'll have to try it more often.

Big Stone Gap is the story of 35-year-old town spinster Ave Maria Mulligan. The story is set in the small Blue Ridge Mountain town of Big Stone Gap, Virginia in the late 1970s. Clearly I was in love with the small town aspects of the story. There is certainly a charming cast of eccentric supporting characters, although they're really minimized in the abridged audiobook I listened to, which is a shame.

Ave Maria's the town pharmacist who's never quite felt like she fit into the life of Big Stone Gap. Her mother was born in Italy and somehow Ave Maria inherited her "foreignness" even though she was born in Virginia. While you miss out on a lot of interesting local color in the audiobook, it did help me focus on Ave Maria's personal struggles as the book is told from her perspective and spends a lot of time with her internal monologues.

It also happens to be a romance, although a very reluctant one. You don't get to be the town spinster without avoiding romance at all costs. Despite the fact that I married relatively young, I still identify with Ave Maria, I worried that I would when I read the book in high school. It's so surprising to reread her romantic development now that I'm old enough to have actually had some romance myself. I never been able to understand why as a teenager I loved the story of this 35-year-old so much, but I think it has something to do with the fact that Ave Maria is about

as romantically developed as a teenager. She's spent so long shutting people out, that she's never really figured out the give and take that's part of romantic relationships.

Plus, in other areas of her life, she really does remind me of me - loves to read, hard-working small town girl, dutiful daughter and all around nice quiet unassuming good girl. She also happens to be best friends with the town librarian, who does anything but fit the typical old-cat-lady stereotype. Iva Lou Wade is essentially Samantha on Sex in the City, except 20 years ago & in rural Virginia.

One other quick thing that hasn't been mentioned, this is the book that made me fall in love with Italy. It plays a relatively small role in this book, yet it all seems so wonderful that I've wanted to visit northern Italy ever since I read it.
